Known at one time as the most famous and expensive prison, the Eastern State Penitentiary is now open to the public for tours and to tell its many tales as the World's first true "Penitentiary". At its prime, Eastern State was home to many notorious criminals including, bank robber "Slick Willie" Sutton and "Scarface" Al Capone.

Visitors can explore the facility freely or be guided via audio tour called "The Voices of Eastern State". There are many interactive activities offered as well. Due to the building's condition and no programming for children, the Penitentiary is not recommended for children under 7 years of age but are welcome to visit and their admission is complimentary.

The museum pass allows up to 6 people free general admission and access to "The Voices of Eastern State" audio tour.
