

Museum of the American Revolution



The Museum of the American Revolution explores the story of the American Revolution by using its collection of Revolutionary-era weapons, personal items, letters, diaries, and works of art. The museum offers galleries, theater experiences, and recreated historical environments to bring to life the Revolution era.

Come and see General Washington's Headquarters Tent, an iconic piece of history where President George Washington slept and made world-changing decisions. Visit other key exhibits that include a two-story replica of the Liberty Tree, which shaded colonists as they discussed a revolt against the British and a large-scale replica of an 18th-century ship that visitors can climb aboard.

You'll also see many tableaux, or life-sized sculptures re-creating people and events of the American Revolution.



- Museum of the American Revolution has a "Timed Ticket" system. Only a certain amount of visitors may be permitted at one time. Museum Pass card holders will have reserved tickets for first available time slots.
- The museum does not allow time slot reservations for future visits and or phone/online ticket orders for Museum Pass cardholders.
- The museum pass allows up to 2 adults and 4 youth (6-17 years old). Children 5 and under get in free, but will still need an entry ticket.

The Museum is open daily from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm, except for major holidays. Please note that the last timed ticket is sold one hour before closing.
